A Note From The Nurse...

Special Health Needs

If your child has any special health needs or problems, this should be communicated to the nurse. This information is kept confidential, and it can be very important to a successful experience in school. Examples of such needs include:

- 1. Food Allergies
- 2. Bee Sting Allergies
- 3. Allergy to any other substances
- 4. Difficulty with vision, hearing or speech
- 5. Need for medication during school hours

Need for special aids such as crutches, walkers or wheelchairs, either on a temporary or permanent basis.

Reasons to keep your child home: Fever, Vomiting, Diarrhea, or advice to keep home from MD. Please keep them home until they are free of these symptoms without medication for 24 hours.

My job is to help any students who may have communication needs such as saying sounds correctly, using good vocabulary skills, listening for information, answering questions, and using fluent speech, which is another way to say I help with stuttering. I work with students in all grades at Edison from Pre-K all the way to 4th grade. Students who receive speech and language services have an IEP in place with specific goals that address their needs. If your child has a speech IEP then they are on my schedule and will be coming for speech therapy a couple times a week.
