

Requirements to attend:


- No behavior referrals in Skyward in October



Social-Emotional Groups Starting After Fall Break

At North Ridge Middle School, we take the mental health and emotional well-being of our students very seriously. After Fall Break, we will be offering small group sessions focused on helping students build skills, find support, and grow stronger together. These sessions will be led by trusted adults. Our school counselors, social workers and home interventionists are here to listen and support students.

The Topics:

Feel like you're stuck in a rut? In this group, we'll explore ways to set achievable goals, overcome procrastination, and build confidence to "level up" both academically and personally.

Grief

Sometimes it feels like no one understands what you're going through. This group offers a safe and supportive space to talk about loss — whether it's a loved one, friend, or pet — and learn healthy ways to cope and heal together.

Confidence Building

Everyone deserves to feel proud of who they are. This group helps students recognize their strengths, silence self-doubt, and develop self-advocacy skills through interactive and fun activities.

Anxiety (The Chill Zone)

Worrying can feel like a full-time job. In this group, students will learn practical strategies to calm their mind and body, identify triggers, and manage stress during tests, social situations, or tough days.

The Details:

Groups will run for 6 weeks. Groups will meet once a week. Groups will meet during lunch or an elective class.


