A note from the principal...

Hello SW families! As the weather continues to be unpredictable, please ensure your child is wearing a coat, hat, and gloves to school each day. We want to be sure your children are protected from the weather.

We will begin our Fastbridge testing February 1st. This will be for 1st grade inperson students and all 2nd-4th grade students. When your student is taking a Fastbridge test it is important to let the student answer on their own. This test helps us know where we can better support your student. If you give your student the answers or guide them in the right direction this skews the data and is a disservice to your child. Kindergarten students will continue taking ESGI testing. Again this is a measure of what your student knows and how we can help them.

State testing will begin in April for 3rd and 4th grade. This test will be for all remote and in-person learners. Remote students will need to come into the building to take the assessment. Safety protocols will be in place to help keep everyone safe. More details to come in March's newsletter.

Please encourage your remote students to participate in class. It is difficult to know what your student needs if they are not engaged in the lesson. Some good habits include: keeping your camera on, answering questions, working in a defined space with less distractions, keeping food/toys/drinks away, having materials accessible.

Pre-K

<u>Kindergarten</u>

Kindergarten has made it to 3rd quarter! Your child should know all the following at this time: identify all letters and sounds, write their first name, write all capitals and lowercase letters, identify all shapes, identify numbers to 10, and count by 10's and 1's to 50. If your child is not able to do these things, please work on these skills at home. Reminder that your child has homework every day that needs to be completed after class for both in-person and remote students. Thank you! We appreciate your support in your child's education.

FIRST GRADE

Valentine's Day is around the corner! We will be talking about how to be kind and caring. Welcome back to in-person students, we are so happy to see you back in the building! Thanks for being patient during remote learning; your cooperation and help was much appreciated. In language arts, we will continue discussing the different story elements: setting, character, narrator, and plot. Ms. Coffman's in-person students will be starting a nonfiction unit on technology while learning how to identify the main idea and key details in a text. For math, they will be practicing applying strategies for subtraction facts. Dr. Brown's and Ms. Randolph's remote learners will continue problem-solving and solving addition and subtraction equations within 10.

Second Grade

It's February! The year seems to be flying by! We are glad to see the in-person students back in the building. We are moving right along with our lessons. We are working through Unit 5: Solving Problems Through Technology. We are working on summarizing, identifying the main topic of a text, and identifying author's purpose. Please continue to read at home to increase comprehension and fluency. Later in the month we will begin Unit 6: Tales to Live by. In math, we are continuing to work on subtracting within 100. Continue to practice this skill as well as the basic facts for fluency. It is important to have that foundation of the basic facts. We will also spend some time learning about some important African Americans during Black History Month and their contributions to history. Thank you for your continued support with your child's learning. It is very much appreciated!

Third Grade

Third grade will be starting Advancements in Technology in Reading. This unit focuses on inventions and how they have advanced through the years. In math we are moving on to adding and subtracting within 1000. Students should continue practicing math facts at home to improve fluency. Please be reading with your students at home. This will help them so much. Just a reminder to all the parents that we appreciate all of your hard work as well as your students.

Fourth Grade

Hello 4th grade families! We are still having a lot of issues with students getting their independent work done at home. Be sure to help your student keep up with their work since there isn't much time to work on skills in class this year. Be sure to practice multiplication facts, reading books together, and any other assignments given in class. We know this year is so hard for everyone and we appreciate your support at home!

A Note from Nurse High

All new Pre K students and all Kindergarten students must have a school physical completed within the past year, a blood lead test and present a current immunization record. This was all required to be turned in to the school nurse by 10/15/2020. If you have not turned in the required paperwork, your child is now considered NON-COMPLIANT, which means they will not be allowed to attend any in person learning or extra-curricular activities until the required documentation has been turned in. If/when we get released to return to all in person learning, your child will NOT be allowed to attend if they are non-compliant.
