Tips for the Start of the Year!

Starting a new school year can be an exciting but stressful time for you and your child. Here are some tips to make sure your child gets the most out of his or her school year (Scholastic.com):

- Sleep for school. Setting up a regular bedtime and wake-up routine is a crucial step to prepare your child for class and a practical way to cut down on stress at the start of the year.
- **Connect.** Communicating with your child's teacher on a regular basis is an essential part of caring for his or her education. Teachers can alert you to any emotional, social, or academic difficulties they perceive in your child at school. The same works in reverse: notify teachers about changes that might affect your child's behavior in school.
- Look up to learning. If your child is feeling a bit anxious about going back to school, keep a positive attitude. Recall the fun and exciting events, field trips, projects, and so on from years past, and show excitement about the opportunities for learning new things in the upcoming year.
- Talk it out. Asking your child about school is important. It shows him that you value his or her education. Try to avoid general questions, like "How was your day?" These will most likely produce one-word answers. Instead, be specific.
- Go farther. Getting involved in school events, if you have time, is a great way to show support and enthusiasm for your child's learning experience. Participating in school activities is also a valuable way of connecting to the school community.
- Bring it home. Helping your child with his homework is an effective way to show concern for what she learns at school. Displaying your child's projects around the house also helps to keep learning excitement high.

Data Driven

Welcome back! This year we will be using a screening tool to test K-4 students. The program is called Fastbridge. Students will screened three times this year; once this fall, once after Winter Break, and once at the end of the school year. This test will help us determine which students may need extra support and which students we need to offer enrichment to. The test gives us baseline data on each students academic levels in Reading and Math. We will begin testing when we return from Labor Day weekend. Our team looks forward to working with your students and you again this year to help them achieve academic success!

Southwest is an AVID School! AVID stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination.
