

Danville Viking Families:

Happy Fall! It is hard to believe that we have been in school for over a month and we continue to learn
that this has really been a difficult transition, but we are making it work. Don't get me wrong, we still have
lots of work to do, but our students are making improvements every day and that is what it's all about. I have been asking for your support and continue to ask for support in respect to discipline related to cell
phones so that we keep our students in school, and create a positive learning environment for all students.

Danville High School has steady enrollment numbers in comparison to last year. What does that mean? That means our students want to be in school and want to learn. This is so important for the success of our students, but we cannot forget the expectations that the Board of Education has set in place are there to ensure the success of all Danville High School students. It is necessary and imperative that parents support us in this journey so that we can have the safest and most respectful learning environment for our students and teachers.

Academically, we are focusing on AVID building-wide and closing those achievement gaps that have been caused due to COVID. The AVID methodologies will allow our teachers to utilize many strategies that require students to be more engaged and will also provide more rigor during the instructional time. Now that AVID has a more inclusive approach, it is much easier to integrate and allow all students to benefit from the methods that work.

We have some exciting events coming up very quickly. Homecoming is October 22nd and 23rd. At this time, we will play Urbana J.V. Friday night, and all other events will be held as well. The dance is scheduled for that Saturday in the DHS Fieldhouse. Much more information will be available to students on the DHS Facebook and website pages. The student expectations are as follows: Beginning Monday, Sept. 27-Oct 22, no unexcused absences and no suspension days. Students must meet the participation expectations to attend. We want all students to be involved in some way and we hope to have a very spirit filled homecoming week and celebration!

We are very close to the end of the first quarter and students it is important to make sure you are getting all work turned in and taking re-takes when appropriate. 


