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# K-12 Articulated Computer Skills & Standards

Angela Wilson, one of our Math Coaches, was recently in a training about the importance of technology skills in student assessments. She made a list of skills our students need to know to be successful with testing. The skills are:

District Mission: To ensure all District 118 students reach their fullest potential

- ① Drag & Drop
- ② Highlight
- 3 Typing using both hands
- 4 Matching using mouse or touchpad
- ⑤ Numerals how to type in answers in appropriate order
- Where & how to find & type signs for the period, comma, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division
- ① Use touchpad or mouse to draw in drawing box
- ® Choosing colors in drawing box option

Mandy Stimac commented that it would be a good idea to break the skills up by grade level.

Gail Lewis commented that her kids were using the Eureka online assessments, and her kids had a good idea of how to use technology for the test. The one thing they struggled with was drag & drop skills.

Cheryl Swafford commented that the size of the screen seems to be what is hardest for her students. They have to scroll down and sometimes that's not always easy because the bar is hidden.

MaryEllen asked everyone to email her any other computer skills their students struggle with.
